Summer survival skills







Two HEROES groups - Sligo/Leitrim and Fermanagh - came together for the first time in August, for an Island Expedition in Lough Allen Adventure. The young people took part in bushcraft activities and developed their survival skills.

On arrival at the centre they were equipped with buoyancy aids, and assigned to teams and a canoe. The first task was to row out to a local island in Drumshanbo. This required physical strength, endurance, good communication and teamwork. It was a tough challenge, but they made it!

Once on the island, the young people collected dry wood and learned how to light their own fire using flint and steel. When the fire was underway, they had a BBQ, hot chocolate and toasted marshmallows.

The teams made shelters from fallen branches, to protect themselves from the elements if they had to stay overnight on the island. Each team scored each other's shelters. Although there was a competitive element to this adventure, the two groups integrated really well as one team and supported each other throughout the day.

HEROES Belfast goes on a boat trip




